This service includes the opportunity to read the end and the beginning of the Torah and to remember your loved ones.

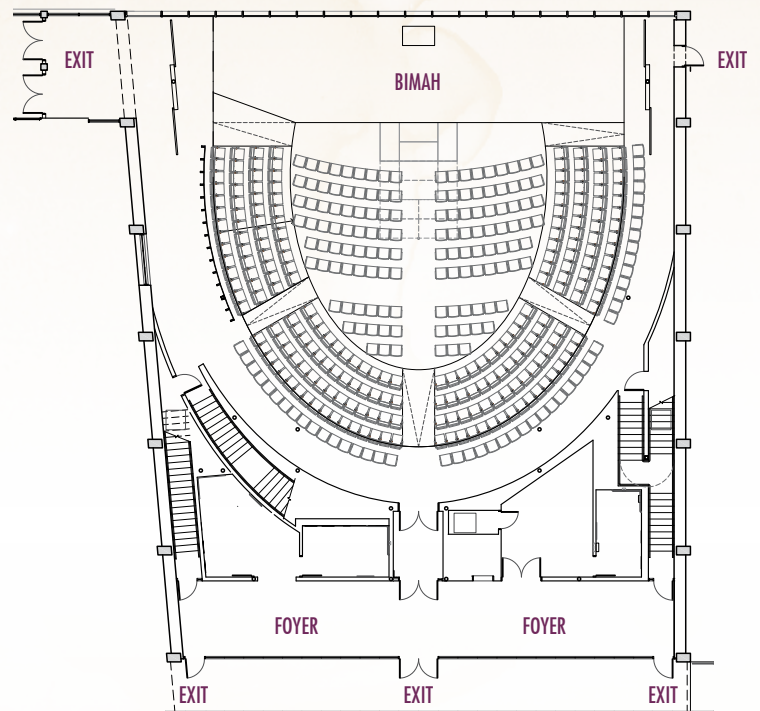
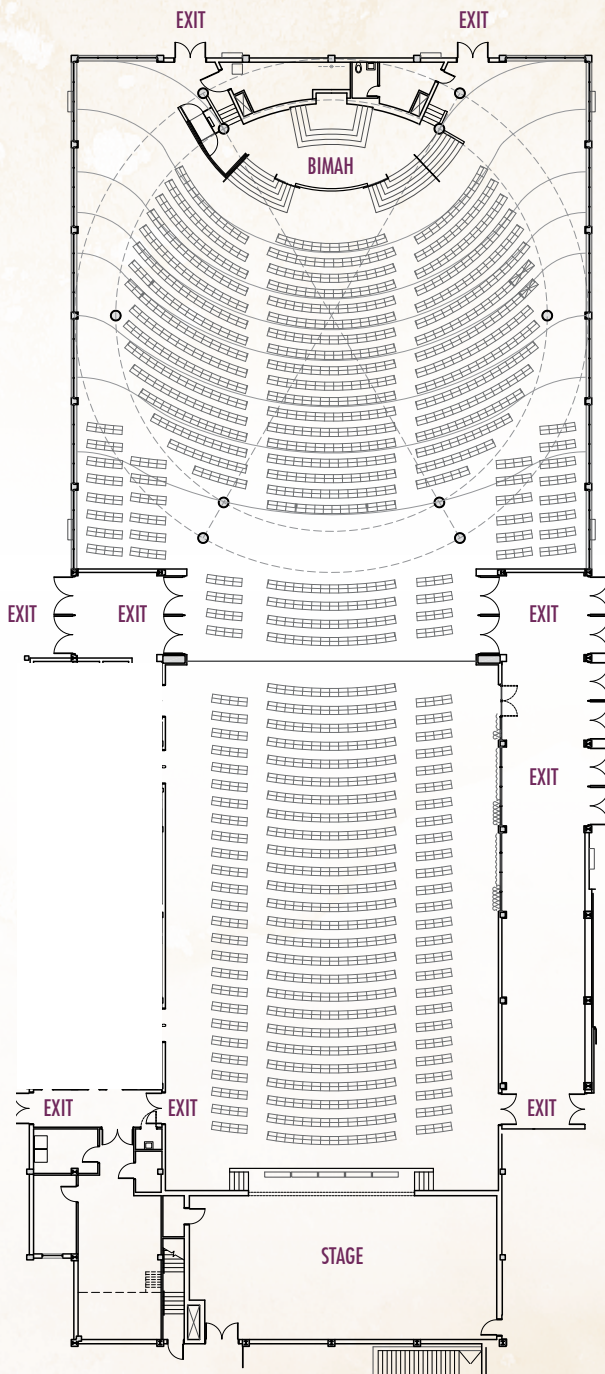
